

Things you might need in a Residence Hall

Personal Items:

1. XL Twin Bed Linens (80 x 36)
2. Bath Towels
3. Bathrobe or wrap
4. Toiletry tote and toiletries
5. Flip flops (for the shower)
6. Toilet paper (for suites and apartments)
7. Trashcan
8. Laundry bag/basket
9. Laundry detergent
10. Eating utensils (plates, glasses, bowls, silverware)
11. Cooking utensils (pots, pans, etc. for the community kitchen)
12. Dish soap and other cleaning supplies (broom, dust pan, mop, etc.)
13. Sewing kit
14. First aid kit
15. Alarm clock
16. Umbrella
17. Backpack
18. Desk or floor lamp (NO halogen lamps)
19. Flashlight
20. Pictures and/or posters (may only be hung with poster putty, painters tape, or 3M command strips)
21. Game console (X-Box, Playstation, etc.)
22. Computer (network cable and hub)
23. Free standing shelves

Items that can or need to be shared by roommates:

1. Television and coaxial cable
2. VCR/DVD player
3. Telephone and cord
4. Microwave (not to exceed 700 watts; one per room/suite)
5. Refrigerator (not to exceed 4.5 cubic feet; one per room/suite)
6. Stereo
7. Extension cords (UL approved) and surge protector

Items that you should NOT bring:

1. Halogen Lamps
2. Candles, incense, or oil lamps
3. Space heaters
4. Appliances with an open heating element such as toasters, hotplates, etc. (George Foreman grills are permitted)
5. Fireworks, Explosives, flammable liquids (gasoline, propane, or starter fluid)
6. Pets (except fish in a 10 gallon or less tank)
7. Duct tape
8. Bed lofts
9. Firearms or other weapons
10. Wireless Routers
11. Portable washers/dryers
