- (05) WOMAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS:** A small business that is at least 51 percent owned by a woman or women who also control and operate it. "Control" in this context means exercising the power to make policy decisions. "Operate" means actively involved in the day to day management.
- (06) WOMAN-OWNED LARGE BUSINESS:** A concern that meets the definition of woman-owned and operated, but which is not a small business by the SBA's standards.
- (07) DISADVANTAGED WOMAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS:** A concern that meets the definitions of both (03) and (05) above.
- (08) DISADVANTAGED WOMAN-OWNED LARGE BUSINESS:** A concern that meets the definitions of both (04) and (06) above.
- (09) HANDICAPPED-OWNED BUSINESS:** A small business which is certified as being at least fifty-one percent controlled by one or more permanently handicapped persons.
- (10) OTHER:** A concern that does not meet any of the above definitions.
